The Police Forces in Spain: Roles, Responsibilities, and Uniforms

Spain has several police forces, each with specific duties and areas of responsibility. The three main police forces are the Policía Local, Policía Nacional, and Guardia Civil. Guardia Civil – Military Police Force

The Guardia Civil is a militarized police force that operates nationwide, particularly in rural areas and smaller towns. It is known for its roles in border control and counterterrorism.

Main Responsibilities:

- Road Traffic Safety: Monitoring and overseeing traffic on highways and rural roads.
- Border and Customs Control: Securing national borders and overseeing imports and exports.
- Environmental Protection: Fighting environmental crimes and protecting natural resources.
- Counterterrorism: Engaging in operations against terrorism and armed groups within Spain.
- Special Units: Deployment of specialized units such as UCO (organized crime unit) and SEPRONA (environmental protection unit).

Uniform:

The Guardia Civil traditionally wears green uniforms, often donning a dark green jacket with a black belt for formal duties. For everyday service, they wear green shirts and trousers, and in tactical operations, they use specialized protective clothing. Their military structure is reflected in their organization and discipline.
